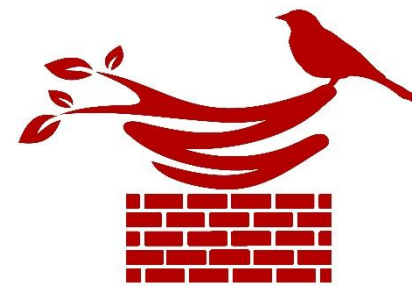
Our School Promise

What does 'Safeguarding' mean?

Safeguarding means:

- 🏠 Keeping children safe from harm.
- 🏠 Helping children feel safe at school and online.
- 🏠 Making sure adults help you when you need it.

When should I tell a grown-up?

Tell a safe grown-up when:

- 🏠 Someone is hurting you.
- 🏠 Someone makes you feel scared, worried or uncomfortable.
- 🏠 Someone asks you to keep a secret that makes you feel bad.
- 🏠 You see someone else being hurt.
- 🏠 You are being bullied (in school or online).
- 🏠 You feel unsafe at home, at school or anywhere else.

How we will try and protect you at school

- 🏠 We try to provide a safe and secure environment for you to learn in.
- 🏠 We help to ensure you remain safe, at home as well as at school.
- 🏠 We think it is important for you to know where to get help if you are worried or unhappy about something.

Who can I talk to?

You can talk to:

- 🏠 Your class teacher
- 🏠 An LSA, Midday Supervisor, someone in the office or even Mr Pearce.
- 🏠 Mrs Garnett and Mrs Long

What Happens If I Tell?

- 🏠 We will listen carefully.
- 🏠 We will take you seriously.
- 🏠 We might need to tell another adult who can help keep you safe.
- 🏠 We will talk to you and explain all of this and you can always go and ask grown-ups questions if you are unsure about anything.
- 🏠 You will not be in trouble for telling.
